### Authorship:

- The <u>narratives</u> of Genesis were no doubt <u>oral</u> traditions the people of Israel told each generation.
- Christian Tradition holds that <u>Moses</u> was the writer to put these oral traditions down in the form of the Pentateuch.
- <u>Theories</u> abound about varying <u>authors</u>:
- **J**—Use of "Yaweh"
- E-Use of "Elahim"
- P—Priestly source, so called because it seems most concerned with aspects of the formal worship of the temple
- D—The Deuteronomic source (Deut—Joshua)
