


OT Books:

General Notes

These three books may be the most <u>neglected</u> in the entire Bible. After Exodus ends the people of Israel are still at Mt Sinai, and God gave more instructions on how they should <u>live</u>; which are found in <u>Leviticus</u>. The book of <u>Numbers</u> is a description of how the Hebrews were <u>organized</u> for their journey to Canaan with more of the story about why it took so long. Deuteronomy is like one long final sermon from Moses at the <u>end</u> of his life. He calls them to recommit themselves to the <u>covenant</u> in preparation for the promised land.
